CLUB RULES AND PROCEDURES

Canoeing can be a high-risk activity. Help us to manage and reduce this risk, by behaving responsibly and adhering to Club rules.

LAKE SESSIONS

Safety

- No paddlers will be allowed onto the water without at least one suitably qualified coach or helper being on the water first.
- Paddlers will leave the water immediately if instructed to do so.
- No paddler shall be alone on the water and social paddlers must be in a group of at least 2 people.
- There will always be at least one suitably qualified first aider/rescuer on the bank of any open water session.
- All paddlers will wear a suitable buoyancy aid whilst on the water.
- All paddlers must enter the water at the approved entry points only.
 I junior paddlers will wear a helmet on open water.
- HCC risk assessment will be available for all members to read.
- Any injury that may occur during sessions, must be notified to an HCC official as soon as possible.
- All equipment will be correctly stowed away after use to avoid damage.
- If your child is below the age of 16 (junior paddler), a parent or guardian must be present during any training.

Other

- Only vehicles transporting boats will be allowed to drive past the barriers.
- Paddlers must respect the environment, wildlife and other users of the lakes.
- All paddlers must register before getting on the water.
- All sessions will be paid for in advance.

POOL SESSIONS

Safety

- No paddlers will be allowed onto the water until a qualified pool attendant is present.
- Follow Pool Safety Operating Procedures as laid down by the venue.
- No swimming or other leisure activities will be allowed during paddling sessions.
- All boats, paddles and equipment must be kept tidily when not in use, as far from the pool's edge as possible.
- Any injury that may occur during sessions, must be reported to a pool attendant as soon as possible.
- If your child is below the age of 16, you must be present during any training

TRIPS

Safety

- All trips will be properly planned in accordance with BCU guidelines by the trip leader.
- No one under the age of 16 will be taken on Club trips, unless accompanied by a parent or nominated guardian.
- The trip organiser will assess the ability of the paddlers wanting to participate and decide on suitability. The trip leaders decision will be final.
- Trip leaders will be responsible for ensuring suitable throw lines and first aid equipment are carried on all trips as required.
- Paddlers are responsible for providing their own equipment and for ensuring that it is of a good condition and suitable for the conditions and purpose of the trip.
- Club equipment may be made available for use to members on a discretionary basis. Any damage or loss will be the responsibility of the person using that equipment (parent or guardian for junior member).
 Members will be required to transport the equipment to the venue.

Code of conduct for adult members

Hinckley Canoe Club is fully committed to safeguarding and promoting the well-being of all its members, ensuring a positive and enjoyable experience for all. The club believes that it is important that members, coaches, administrators and parents associated with the club should, at all times, show respect and understanding for the safety and welfare of others. Therefore, members are encouraged to be open at all times and to share any concerns or complaints that they may have about any aspect of the club with any committee member

As a member of Hinckley Canoe Club, you are expected to abide by the following code of practice:

- All members must take responsibility in ensuring they are up to date with the rules, understand and adhere to them.
- All members must respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of age, gender, ability, race, cultural background, religious beliefs or sexual identity.
- Members should recognise the valuable contribution made by coaches and officials who are usually volunteers. They give their time and resources to provide paddlesport for you

- All members must respect all coaches and leaders and respect all decisions that are made
- All members should be a positive role model, treat other players and officials with the same level of respect you would expect to be shown to you.
- Use correct and proper language at all times (No Swearing)
- Members are not allowed to smoke, consume alcohol or drugs on club premises or whilst representing the club.
- Members must wear suitable kit and clothing for all sessions
- Bullying of any sort will not be tolerated. Encourage everyone to enjoy sport and understand that people have different motivations for taking part.
- Members must pay any fees for training or events promptly.
